CENTER FOR EFFICIENT GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES NEW LEADERSHIP

TALLAHASSEE – Department of Management Services Secretary William S. Simon, Chair of the Center for Efficient Government, today announced that Deputy Secretary Robert H. Hosay will succeed Pamela Pfeifer, who resigned effective today. Created through an Executive Order signed by Governor Jeb Bush in March, the Center for Efficient Government streamlines the state's outsourcing activities in order to identify and realize cost-savings.

"Pam's organizational skills were instrumental in getting the Center up and running," said Secretary Simon. "I look forward to Robert's leadership and ability to advance the Center's mission as he picks up the torch. Not only is Robert among the best contract attorneys in the state, he brings to the table a wealth of government procurement expertise."

Hosay will be charged with directing the Center's statewide effort to evaluate present and future outsourcing initiatives, promote best business practices and leverage agencies' resources for greater effectiveness, accountability and service delivery.

Most recently, Hosay served at the Department of Management Services as Deputy Secretary of Operations and previously as Director of State Purchasing. Prior to joining the public sector, he was an attorney with the Tallahassee law firm of Pennington, Moore, Wilkinson, Bell & Dunbar, P.A., where he concentrated in the areas of corporate and contract transactions, administrative law and insurance defense litigation. He attended the Florida State University College of Law and graduated with honors in 1999.
